### General Membership Meeting of July 17, 2008 MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by the vice president, Norm Rutledge at 10:35. The Pledge to the Flag followed. The minutes of the last meeting were approved as published in *The Chip Pile*. The Treasurer, Ray Kropke, gave the balances of the club and the show. Kathi Clark, Membership Chairman, reported that we have 150 members.

The classes being offered this summer are a beginning wood burning class and Roland Ellis' series of classes. There is a sheet available for members to make suggestions for future classes. There may be hands-on opportunities for carvers to learn tool sharpening in the Fall.

Any member may bring carving materials to sell on general meeting days.

Members are encouraged to enter carvings in the County Fair. If they continue to have only a few carvings entered, the carving category may be eliminated. Kathi explained some of the entrance procedures.

Carving tools for future beginners' classes were discussed. One option would be to have the club purchase good tools, lend them to the beginning carvers, and then, if they wanted to continue carving, the carvers could purchase the tools when they complete the class. Another suggestion was to have the beginning carvers purchase a good set of tools when the class begins and then if they don't want to continue carving, the club would buy back the tools. Larry Yudis, of the Woodcraft Shop, recommended Denny tools as the best value. He also sent us a set of Mikisyo tools selling for \$25.00 to try. Club members will use these tools for a month and report their opinions at the next meeting.

Kathi reported that there are about 40 people living in this area who are former club

The meeting adjourned at 11:15.

The Arkansas Craft School, a proposed year round school for different crafts at Mountain View, wants information on setting up a wood carving class.

The totem pole restoration project has been delayed by the baseball season at Cooper Park.

Kathi Clark suggested having beginner-carving classes on Thursday mornings and afternoons. This would encourage carvers to stay later. It would also provide an additional opportunity for teachers and beginners who are unable to attend mornings. Norm said that classes should be held from 9:00 until 12:00, giving beginning carvers a chance to finish their projects. Students will have more pride in a completed carving.

On Thursday, August 21, Norm Allen of channel 19 will be present to videotape our

General Meeting for broadcast. Members are requested to bring carvings for Show and Tell and also carvings to work on during the morning.

Cindy Stephens has paid for two booths for carvers at the Chili Cook-off on September 6 in Lakeview. All carvers will be encouraged to participate.

Dave McConkey made a motion to adjourn. The meeting was adjourned at 11:15.



### **SHAVING HORSE**

Richard Arndt has a detailed materials list and plans for the shaving horse (below). If anyone wants the plans and list, contact Richard. There is a cost of \$15.00.



note A: 3-1/2" wide  $\times$  1-3/4" thick  $\times$  8-1/2" long. The length of this board should be adjusted to the height of the user. It is morticed into the seat and slanted work surface. It is not a through mortice and is held in place with two nails.

note B: 4" wide x 1-7/8" thick x 37" long. This was made from green wood that had a natural curve and was cut to shape with an ax, saw and draw knife. The 1/2" adjusting holes were drilled by trial and error to fit the work to be held. Holes are closer to the edge of the wood near the user.
