Don Lesiak carved an Eagle bust in a Len Dillon class; and also four Easter bunny candlesticks. Lucia Pairolero carved and wood burned a relief carving of a bear crawling over a log with a Minwax finish, and wood burned a picture of a Loon. She also carved a relief

Santa in Bruce Futterer's class. Dale Lakin did a relief carving of The Old Barn in bass wood. Donalee Phillips, a beginning carver, carved a Hound Dog and a Civil War veteran. Board of Directors Meeting of April 3, 2008 MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by the Vice President, Norm Rutledge. Photographing of members for the photo directory is continuing. Ray said that he will coordinate the repairs to the totem poles in Cooper Park when the weather is warmer and dryer.

Approximately 25 new members have come from the beginner classes. Name tags were discussed, and Sandy suggested that name tags could be carved in a beginner class. Don Davis will be asked about teaching a wood burning class for name tags.

The Mentor Program for new members was discussed. It was decided that new carvers should be shown different types of carving and then surveyed to find out their interests before being matched with a mentor.

Kathi reported that we currently have 131 members. She has emailed or called former members who have not paid dues for this year. Members who are not current with their dues will no longer receive *The Chip Pile*.

Sandy said she will email Norm Allen about putting information about our carving show on Channel 19. Items are still needed for the auction. There are 4 openings in Desiree Hajny's class May 5,6,&7.

The club will purchase 2"x2"x12" basswood from the show's wood vendor to sell to club members. Ray said that of the \$1300 spent on wood from Len Dillon, \$1000 has already been sold.

A club table will be set up at the Cotter Fish Festival, April 18 from 12:00 (set up from 9-11) to 5:00 & April 19 from 10:00 to 5:00. All carvers are encouraged to participate. Raffle tickets for one of our canes will be sold for \$1.00 each or 6 for \$5.00.

Three more carved blocks are needed to complete our cane project. Any one who still has a carved block is asked to turn it in.

It was decided that a carved remembrance from the club will be given to family members at the funeral of a member or former member. Sid offered several crosses to be carved.

The meeting adjourned at 11:15.

Sawdust Can Kill You

You bet it can! If you breath in sawdust, it will clog your lungs just as quick as tobacco tars. Us older members know people who are on oxygen full time and others who have died from emphysema (which is a lung disease).

People who have carved for a while need to be reminded of this and new carvers need to become aware of this. Recently I saw an article listing the various woods from which the sawdust can harm you. The sawdust from some woods are worse than others, but all are dangerous.

When using a tool (such as a Dremel, Foredom, sander, band saw, table saw or similar tool) that creates sawdust, one should use either a face mask, a shop vacuum system, or a box that traps sawdust. I've got a pattern for such a box and I think I've seen Dick Dulaney use one.
