Hello everyone and Happy New Year!

Well here we are in the new year. Hope it finds all well and happy. If you have not paid your dues for 2019, please do so ASAP. You can send them in to our club mail at: NAWC, P.O. Box 531, Mountain Home, AR 72654, or to me at Marty Wells, P.O. Box 156, Gamaliel, AR 72537. Please make your checks payable to NAWC and remember it is \$20 for one person and \$30 for a couple. Once we receive them, we will get them to our membership chairmen. We usually try to have this done by January so please mail it in or bring it to the club right away.

We completed all of the cutouts for our club projects and have been distributing them at the club meetings. If you didn't get one, please see me next meeting to get yours. These need to be finished by March or April so we can have them for the show in May. If the painting bothers you, just carve and sign them, bring them in, and we will get them painted.

The board decided to not buy large quantities of our club shirts anymore because it is very hard to determine what colors people want and we do not sell any at our events. So, if you want a club shirt, please go to The Shirt Shop on Hwy. 5 across from the radio station (KTLO) to get it. There you can take your own new shirt or select a color from their stock and they will print it while you wait. This way you get exactly what you want. It does cost about \$1-\$1.50 more per shirt from the price they gave us but we had to buy about 30-50 at a time and sometimes had colors no one wanted.

Beginners classes will start on Jan. 17. We have started our ad on the radio and in the newspaper. We are hoping to generate some new members this way. Be sure to tell your friends about our class.

We gave \$650 to four charities last month. They were Salvation Army, Backpacks 4 Kids, Mountain Home Food Basket and Bob Davis Vets Center. That means we raised \$2600 for charity last year. We also took 165 lbs. of food and \$120 in checks to the food basket from our food drive at our Christmas party. You should all be very proud of what we accomplish for our local charities. That is what makes our club stand out from the rest and what makes me proud to say I am part of this club. Please keep doing the great things you do.
