General Membership Meeting of September 18, 2014

MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by the vice president, Norm Rutledge, at 10:30. Following the Pledge to the Flag, Paul Baumann made a motion, which was carried, that the minutes of the last meeting be accepted. The treasurer, Janet Cardwell, gave the treasurer's report.

Membership stands at 173. The Shirkey's will start accepting dues for the year 2015 in October. The dues remain at \$15.00 per person or \$20.00 per couple.

Books from the library are being looked at and the show committee will determine if they can be used for the show or if they should remain in the library.

Marty Wells has another owl class beginning Sept. 25. Naomi Inglett will give a relief ship carving class Oct. 30 - Nov. 13. Jackie Miller will teach chalk painting class Nov. 6th. Have a carving ready for chalk painting by the time of the class.

The show committee will meet next week, Sept. 24th. The purchase of new tablecloths was discussed with several people stating that Batesville would be a good place to check for fabric.

Deen Shirkey reported that the Christmas party will be held on Dec. 4th. The tickets will go on sale on Oct. 2nd at the price of \$5.00 each. The club will furnish the meat of smoked brisket or chicken and dessert. Guests should bring the side dishes. All who would like to participate in the gift exchange should bring a small handmade gift that would fit into a small lunch bag. Gifts must be handmade, but do not have to be carvings. Bring gifts unwrapped and the committee will put them in bags.

Norm mentioned that Chuck Bailey would be willing to come and critique carvings, but there wasn't any interest by the members. Debbe Edwards will not be the show judge for the upcoming show because of conflict of schedules. Any suggestions for a new judge? Hospice would like some comfort crosses. Paul suggested that we give them some of various sizes to fit men's and women's hands. Mary Wells seconded the motion. Bob Ahrens, Paul Baumann and Norm Rutledge will do some cut outs and bring them next week. The crosses should be well rounded and sanded well so that they don't damage the fragile skin of the patients. Tung oil and a good lacquer were suggested for a finish.

The chess set for next year's fund raiser was discussed and Lynda Heydt made a motion that we do a hillbilly theme. We need someone to do the cut outs.
