## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

By the time you read this, our Show Committee has already put or will be putting out the Wood Carvers Show signs all over town. It's a tremendous amount of work that our Show Committee has to do in setting up and running the show so I hope everyone appreciates that and does his or her part in volunteering at the event. I also encourage our members to rent a table to display their carvings. You can split a table with someone else if you need to. We will have sign up sheets for the show at the info table at our meetings. Please select a day and time slot when you can be there. We will need volunteers for the entrance table, the charity/club info table, the raffle table and the giveaway table.

Speaking of the Show signs, some members went to our storage shed to see which sign frames needed repair. There were quite a few of them. After all, we have had them for about 20 years. It was decided rather than spending money to temporarily fix them plus the labor to repair them; we would use that money and labor toward building all new frames. Now instead of on-site assembling each of the old frame pieces with screws, and bolts, our new frames will be permanently constructed in two parts to simplify installation. Just drop the frame section into the base section, install 4 bolts and wing nuts and *poof-de-woo*, you're done.

Please donate more carvings for the Charity/Raffle tables. We have sold a lot the past year and we need to renew our stock. I believe we need more Comfort Crosses and Comfort Birds as well.

Our new sharpening system is here. Curt was given a check to purchase it when he was at a carving class. Anyone interested in using it should first check with Curt, Norm, or Sid.

Jason has picked up new cartridges for our copier. If you need to use it to copy patterns from a book or for whatever reason, remember, the cost is 10 cents per sheet. You can give the money to either our treasurer Rod or myself. That money will go for replacing the cartridges when they no longer print well.

Finally, please consider teaching a carving class to our members. Check our info table for other carving class dates to avoid scheduling conflicts. We need to have classes throughout the year to remain, not a good, but a great carving club.

### MINUTES

Sonia will research the possibility of purchasing of some unusual carving wood that was offered in an email. Photos of carvings at last year's show are now on our website.

By motion made and carried, Rod Engle and Ray now have access to our safe deposit box.

One of our raffle items for this year, a beautiful chess set in a presentation box made by Ray, was displayed at this meeting.

Show and Tell followed. Kathi Clark carved Pups in relief, a donkey bottle stopper, and a pretty, old lady. Sid Edelbrock carved a large Santa Claus. Norm Rutledge showed a rabbit he had carved from a Debbe Edwards rough-out. Naomi Inglett carved chicks and eggs displayed in an Easter basket. Margaret Killen carved a Phoenix spoon in butternut and finished with oil paint and linseed oil. Curt Shirkey carved a dogwood broach and a cross. Paul Baumann showed the 2010 carved quilt and a broom handle that may have been carved by Tom Wolfe (*Editor's note: Tom Wolfe did indeed carve the wood spirit broom circa 1970s. It is carved from a single piece of water birch*). Karen Myer carved a Razorback in relief. Tom Cardwell carved an elf shelf sitter. Ray Killen showed a cave man that he had carved. Sonia Nelson carved an angel for the nativity. Ken Doran carved cedar bookends and a relief in cedar of the owl and the pussy cat. Sandy Smith carved a fish whistle and a dog whistle.

The name tag winner was Penny Wells, the Show and Tell winner was Curt Shirkey, and the 50/50 winner was Rudy Betzold.

The meeting adjourned at 10:40.

The meeting adjourned at 10:45.

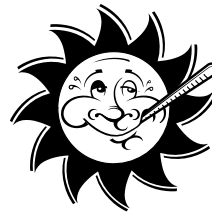
