Marty Wells and Red Murr will contact KTLO to be interviewed about the carving club on "The Talk of the Town" radio program. A discussion ensued about the type of carvings for the farm scene. A motion was made and passed that the animals would be caricature. Motion made and passed that we need to purchase a book for patterns.


