General Membership Meeting of March 15, 2018 MINUTES

The meeting was brought to order at 10:35 by President Marty Wells. The Pledge of Allegiance was made by all. *Minutes* were approved by Paul Baumann and seconded by Rick Wheeler.

Marty gave the Treasurer's report based on an email report sent

by vacationing Treasurer Ray Killen. Librarian Sonia Nelson asked members who want specific books for the library to please let her know. She will be looking for the books and will look to purchase them at the show/or online.

Quartermaster Paul Baumann has ordered \$2,300 or \$2,400 of wood that will be delivered at the show. This cuts the cost (as there is no delivery cost) of the wood by about 75%. The club rounds up the cost (eg: 2.85 up to 3.00) and makes a minimal amount. The storage unit is shared by the club's wood and the show committee's signs, etc. and costs \$540 per year. We get a discount because we pay a year at a time. Paul announced that he will be taping a KTLO show in the near future and it will be aired the end of April and first part of May. Membership chairpersons Linda and Ray Peacy stated that we have 115 paid members so far this year. Webmaster Sandy Smith said that everything is going smoothly. Vice President Rick Wheeler stated that he has no class scheduled at this time. Ms. Sunshine Amy Wainscott was absent. A condolence card was sent around as her mother-in-law passed away. Marty announced that Deen Shirkey was in the hospital in Fayetteville and was hopeful of being sent for Rehab in Mountain Home on Friday. Our thoughts and prayers go out to both of these families.

Bonnie Davis wanted to make sure that people were aware that they could attend the Saturday night Show Banquet and festivities without having a table at the show. Both Marty and Bonnie reminded people of Ron Allison's 3 day class after the show. The sign up sheet is on the table. Barb Edelbrock announced that she will need help with the Charity and snack table that we provide at the show. Please see her and offer to help. Red Murr asked for input in how to pack items for transport to the show or the club. A number of people offered suggestions. These suggestions are helpful for both seasoned and novice carvers. Marty announced that he brought in some western cedar hearts for a necklace. He has the small silver-plated rings to screw into the wood that will make it into a necklace as well. He cut out 42 or so for today and will make more if people are interested. He will give 2, out to each person who is interested. Those people who took 2 may keep one and return the other to the club to be donated to the charity table. If people are interested, he will look for other 1-day projects for the club. We are always looking to replenish items for the charity table. Marty read the list that Cheryl McConkey supplied of members whose birthdays and anniversaries were in February and March. Congratulations to all.

There was no old or new business.
